Adams, Douglas **The Hitchhiker's Guide to The Galaxy** **Teen Center Fiction**
Humorous story chronicling the journeys, notions, and acquaintances of reluctant galactic traveler Arthur Dent.

Anderson, M.T. **Feed** **Teen Center Fiction**
In a future where most people have computer implants in their heads to control their environment, a boy meets an unusual girl who is in serious trouble.

Bertagna, Julie **Exodus** **Teen Center Fiction**
In the year 2100, Mara discovers the existence of sky cities that are safe from the storms and rising waters, and convinces her people to travel from their threatened island to one of these cities in order to save themselves. *Sequel: Zenith*

Card, Orson Scott **Ender's Game** **Science Fiction**
An expert at simulated war games, Andrew "Ender" Wiggin believes that he is engaged in one more computer war game when, in truth, he is commanding the last Earth fleet against an alien race seeking Earth's complete destruction.

Clarke, Arthur C. **The Hammer of God** **Science Fiction**
As an asteroid named "Kali" hurtles toward earth on a collision course that spells the end to life on the planet, a lone spaceship armed with a weapon to alter the asteroid's path attempts to carry out its perilous mission--unaware that others are simultaneously working for earth's destruction.

When two gargantuan, human-made monsters clash over the future of the human race and the planet, fourteen-year-old Anna Mallahide has a hard time convincing her classmate, Chris Pitman, that he must play a role in the outcome of their epic battle.

Fisher, Catherine **Incarceron** **Teen Center Fiction**
To free herself from an upcoming arranged marriage, Claudia, the daughter of the Warden of Incarceron, a futuristic prison with a mind of its own, decides to help a young prisoner escape.

Goldman, E.M. **The Night Room** **Teen Center Fiction**
When a group of students uses an experimental computer program that simulates their tenth high school reunion, they get an unsettling look at their possible futures.

Goodman, Alexandra **The Other Side of the Island** **Teen Center Fiction**
Born in the eighth year of Enclosure, ten-year-old Honor lives in a highly regulated colony with her defiant parents, but when they have an illegal second child and are taken away, it is up to Honor and her friend Helix, another "Unpredictable," to uncover a terrible secret about their Island and the Corporation that runs everything.

Haddix, Margaret **Turnabout** **Teen Center Fiction**
Melly and Anny Beth participated in a science project to grow younger and since the process cannot be stopped, they must find someone to take care of them in their youth.

Kaye, Marilyn **Here Today, Gone Tomorrow** **Teen Center Pbk**
Emily's classmates lack faith in her ability to see the future and when her premonitions become more clear and certain, she has trouble convincing them to heed her warnings about a dangerous event that will soon take place.

King, Stephen **The Stand** **Fiction**
A rapidly mutating flu virus is accidentally released from a U.S. military facility and wipes out 99 percent of the world's population, thus setting the stage for an apocalyptic confrontation between Good and Evil.

Lloyd, Saci **The Carbon Diaries 2015** **Teen Center Fiction**
In 2015, when England becomes the first nation to introduce carbon dioxide rationing in a drastic bid to combat climate change, sixteen-year-old Laura documents the first year of rationing as her family spirals out of control. *Sequel: Carbon Diaries 2017*

Lowry, Lois **The Giver** **Teen Center Pbk**
Given his lifetime assignment at the Ceremony of Twelve, Jonas becomes the receiver of memories shared by only one other in his community and discovers the terrible truth about the society in which he lives.

Malley, Gemma **The Resistance** **Teen Center Fiction**
In a future England where young people, or "Surpluses," are heavily regulated and everyone takes a drug called Longevity, a member of the Underground infiltrates the Pincent Pharma manufacturing plant, and uncovers horrific acts being committed in an attempt to create eternal youth.

Nix, Garth **Shade's Children** **Teen Center Pbk**
In a savage post-nuclear world, four young fugitives attempt to overthrow the bloodthirsty rule of the Overlords with the help of Shade, their mysterious mentor.

Paulsen, Gary **The Transall Saga** **Teen Center Pbk**
While backpacking in the desert, thirteen-year-old Mark falls into a tube of blue light and is transported into a more primitive world, where he must use his knowledge and skills to survive.

Pfeffer, Susan Beth **Life as we Knew it** **Teen Center Fiction**

When a rumor appears on the Internet that a giant asteroid is about to destroy Earth, Legs Hanover scrambles to meet the boy of her dreams, elusive Andros Bliss.

Sutherland, Tui **So This is How it Ends** **Teen Center Fiction**
During an earthquake in the year 2012 five teens are transported seventy-five years into the future, where the end of the world is imminent, and are drawn together by a mysterious force. *Sequel: Shadow Falling*

Westerfeld, Scott **Uglies** **Teen Center Pbk**
Just before their sixteenth birthdays, when they will be transformed into beauties whose only job is to have a great time, Tally's best friend runs away and Tally must find her and turn her in, or never become pretty at all. **Sequels: Pretties, Specials, Extras.**

Westerfeld, Scott **So Yesterday** **Teen Center Fiction**
Hunter Braque, a New York City teenager who is paid by corporations to spot what is "cool," combines his analytical skills with girlfriend Jen's creative talents to find a missing person and thwart a conspiracy directed at the heart of consumer culture.

Yolen, Jane & Bruce Coville **Armageddon Summer** **Teen Center Pbk**
Fourteen-year-old Marina and sixteen-year-old Jed accompany their parents' religious cult, the Believers, to await the end of the world atop a remote mountain, where they try to decide what they themselves believe.
