Archer, Jeffrey

Paths of Glory

Fiction

A fictionalized account of the life of teacher George Mallory follows his brilliant education, service in World War I, and his fatal attempt to summit Mount Everest in 1924.

Breslin, Theresa

Remembrance

Teen Center Fiction

The destinies of two Scottish families, one of shopkeepers and one of wealth and power, become entwined through their involvement in World War I, social causes, and love.

Carey, Kate

Bloodline: a novel

Teen Center Fiction

In this story told primarily through journal entries, a British soldier in World War I makes the horrifying discovery that his regiment commander is descended from Count Dracula. (sequel: The Reckoning)

Frost, Helen

Crossing Stones

Teen Center Fiction

In their own voices, four young people, Muriel, Frank, Emma, and Ollie, tell of their experiences during the first World War, as the boys enlist and are sent overseas, Emma finishes school, and Muriel fights for peace and women's suffrage.

Hamley, Dennis

Without Warning: Ellen's Story, 1914-1918

Teen Center Fiction

An English working-class girl comes of age during World War I, as she witnesses the horrors of war and decides to become a nurse on the front lines.

Farewell to Arms

Fiction

An American's love for an English nurse during the First World War ends in tragedy.

Lehane, Dennis

The Given Day

Fiction

An epic tale set at the end of World War I follows the experiences of a family whose lives mirror the political unrest of an America caught between its well-patterned past and an unpredictable future.

Mignola, Mike

Baltimore, or The Steadfast Tin Soldier

Fiction

Golden, Christopher

After unwittingly awakening the wrath of a vampire on the World War I battlefields, Lord Henry Baltimore vows to vanquish the evil that he has unleashed on the world, in an illustrated tale of the paranormal that serves as an allegory for the nature of war.

Perry, Anne

No Graves as Yet: a Novel of World War I

Mystery

In June of 1914, Cambridge professor Joseph Reavley learns that his father was carrying a vitally important secret document vanished when he died, and that his best student has been murdered.

Remarque, Erich Maria

All Quiet on the Western Front

Fiction

Tells the story of young Paul Baumer--who enlists in the German Army in World War I and takes his place with his comrades in the trenches.

Sedgwick, Marcus

The Foreshadowing

Teen Center Fiction

Having always been able to know when someone is going to die, Alexandra poses as a nurse to go to France during World War I to locate her brother and to try to save him from the fate she has foreseen for him.

Steel, Danielle

A Good Woman

Fiction

Her life and family changed forever by the sinking of the Titanic, Annabelle Worthington flees New York for war-torn France, where, in a field hospital run by women in the midst of World War I, she finds her true calling in medicine.

Wilder, Gene

My French Whore

Fiction

Recounts the tale of a midwestern World War I soldier whose capture by German forces prompts him to impersonate a famous German spy and pursue a romantic relationship with a beautiful courtesan.

Maisie Dobbs (series)

Mystery

Psychologist-sleuth Maisie Dobbs is called in by Sir Cecil Lawton to investigate the mystery behind the death of his wife's aviator son during World War I, a mission that brings her face to face with a college friend with ties to the missing pilot.
